## IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON HEALTH AND EDUCATION OF THE DIFFERENTLY ABLED CHILDREN

#### **CONCEPT NOTE**

COVID-19 has affected the mental and physical health of people belonging to different age groups and various strata of the society. A feeling of uncertainty, a sense of loss of control, fear, stress, anxiety, panic and depression owing to the prolonged lockdown, social as well as physical distancing and their associated consequences are telling on the overall health of almost all individuals including the differently abled ones. They are just as vulnerable to anxiety, apprehensions, sadness, grief, irritability, sleep disturbances and withdrawal as their typically abled peers. Consequently, the education of these individuals has also been affected. While some of them are attending online classes, for others these classes are not just an option. Again, some differently abled individuals might need assistance for the basic activities of daily living (ADL), while others may be more independent but may find it difficult to adjust to new rules that a pandemic situation demands. In fact, any crisis situation has different impacts on different individuals with special needs depending on their age, type and degree of mental and physical challenges. This webinar is aimed at providing a platform to sensitize people about the impact of COVID-19 on the health and education of the differently abled individuals, one of the most marginalized sections of our society. They are also disadvantaged at multiple levels during the pandemic situation, more vulnerable to contracting the virus as many of them do not understand the gravity of the situation. It is, indeed, very important that we, as conscious citizens, know more about them and adopt inclusive measures to mainstream them.

Every human life is valuable and capable of enriching our society, thereby making this world a better place to live in.
